

Independent Auditor's Report

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of St Maurice Aged Care Limited (the company), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2017, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the directors' declaration.

In our opinion:

- a. **the accompanying financial report of St Maurice Aged Care Limited is in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, including:**
- (i) **giving a true and fair view of the company's financial position as at 30 June 2017 and of its performance for the year then ended; and**
 - (ii) **complying with Australian Accounting Standards and the Corporations Regulations 2001; and**
- b. **the financial report also complies with International Financial Reporting Standards as disclosed in Note 1**

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 and the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 : Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

Independent Auditor's Report

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of the financial report.
